I. **TIME COVERED:** 0400H – 0730H, 31 January 2026

II. **VENUE:** Trigon Shipping, San Fernando, Cebu

III. **MISSION**

To participate, assist and facilitate in the promotion of safety of life and property at sea in the Sinulog Fluvial Parade held in San Fernando, Cebu.

IV. **CHRONOLOGICAL EVENTS**

At 0400H, members of the 202nd Coast Guard Auxiliary Squadron as well as officers from CGSS San Fernando assembled at Trigon Shipyard, San Fernando, in preparation for the scheduled fluvial procession activity. Personnel accounted for attendance, conducted initial coordination, and finalized operational readiness alongside partner units on site. At 0430H, a pre-operation briefing was conducted. Key points covered included the activity timeline, maritime safety protocols, roles and assignments of auxiliary personnel, vessel positioning, and coordination procedures during embarkation and navigation. Emphasis was placed on passenger safety, proper

loading procedures, and adherence to the designated procession route. Shortly thereafter, M/V Gloria Two arrived at Trigon Shipyard. Upon arrival, the vessel was secured and inspected to ensure readiness for boarding and ceremonial operations. The image of Señor Santo Niño was then respectfully loaded aboard the vessel, followed by the systematic embarkation of passengers, conducted under the supervision of Coast Guard Auxiliary personnel to ensure order, stability, and safety. At 0600H, M/V Gloria Two departed Trigon Port, officially marking the start of the fluvial procession route. The voyage proceeded smoothly as planned, with auxiliary members actively monitoring vessel movement, passenger welfare, and maritime conditions throughout the duration of the procession. At approximately 0730H, the vessel safely returned to Trigon Port, where passengers were orderly disembarked. The image of Señor Santo Niño was carefully unloaded, formally concluding the fluvial procession activity.
