I. **TIME COVERED:** 0900H-1700H, APRIL 22-24, 2026

II. **VENUE:** IEC Convention Center, Cebu

III. **MISSION:**

To actively promote and implement marine environmental protection through awareness, education, and coordinated action—fostering sustainable coastal practices, preserving marine biodiversity, and strengthening community engagement among stakeholders during the Cebu Maritime Expo 2026.

IV. **CHRONOLOGICAL EVENTS:**

The Cebu Maritime Expo 2026, held from April 22–24, 2026 at the IEC Convention Center, Cebu City, serves as a comprehensive three-day convergence of maritime stakeholders focused on advancing maritime excellence, policy reforms, industry innovation, and sustainable growth. The event features a structured program of opening ceremonies, technical discussions, policy forums, and industry presentations covering shipbuilding, maritime governance, coastal security, and global maritime trends, as reflected across the multi-day conference agenda. A key highlight is the strong representation from the Philippine Coast Guard, underscoring its central role in maritime safety, security, and environmental protection. Notable figures include ADMIRAL RONNIE GIL GAVAN PCG, Commandant of the PCG, whose presence reinforces national maritime leadership, along with senior officers

such as RADM AGAPITO BIBAT PCG, Commander of CGDCV, CDR LADY CHATTERLY SUMBELING PCG, and RADM WENIEL AZCUNA PCG, all contributing expertise on coastal law enforcement, maritime operations, and strategic initiatives.

Complementing the PCG leadership, the PCGA is also prominently represented, highlighting the importance of civilian volunteer support in maritime governance. Special recognition is given to AUX COMMO JOSE EMERY ROBLE PCGA of 217 CGAS for his role in maritime policy and port modernization discussions, as well as representing from 202<sup>nd</sup> CGAS & Trigon Shipyard, AUX LCDR CRYSTAL SUNSHINE DELA TORRE-ARRIOLA & AUX LCDR BENEDICT LUIS ARRIOLA PCGA, reflecting strong industry–auxiliary collaboration in advancing shipbuilding and maritime development. Overall, the three-day expo emphasizes a unified “One Maritime” approach—integrating government, auxiliary, and private sector stakeholders to address evolving maritime challenges while promoting safety, sustainability, and innovation across the Philippine maritime domain.
